
Court Appointed Special Advocates: Empowers community members to serve as Volunteer Advocates and to be a voice for the

Victim Support: Brings together community resources to speed the healing to child victims of abuse and trauma. CAC collaborates with a multi-disciplinary team in

the investigation of specific child abuse cases while also providing case reviews, free therapy, family advocacy, courtroom preparation/accompaniment, and raising community education/awareness of the problem of child sexual abuse.

High-Quality Childcare: Provides educational programs for infants through Pre-K children and school-aged children during the summer. Fees for the year-round program are based on household income with scholarships available. Breakfast, lunch, snacks, baby bottles, formula, and baby food are provided at no additional cost. Quarterly assessments help ensure all children meet their developmental milestones so they leave kindergarten ready. There are five locations: Carver, Guadalupe, New Directions, Phenix, and Talkington.

Family Legal Services: Provides low income clients in 12 counties across West Texas with first-rate legal assistance, advocacy, and quality counsel in matters of family and elder

law. Family law matters include protection from domestic violence, stability of the family in divorce, child support, uncontested adoptions, and suits affecting the parent child relationship. Elder law includes medical and statutory durable power of attorney, physician's directives, and simple wills. Brief advice and referrals are available for walk-ins and by phone.

Adult Education Services: Programs include GED Prep; English as a Second Language which focuses on reading, writing, speaking, and understanding English; and basic

education programs to help adult learners and those with dyslexic tendencies improve their reading, writing, and math skills.

Early Childhood and Family Literacy: Encourages children to begin reading from an early age through storytimes, events, and book distributions. All programs are free of charge.

Utilizing degreed and certified parent educators, the evidence based model for services provides twice monthly home visits as well as group activities to families from prenatal through kindergarten entry. In addition to the educational components of the program, families are also assisted in connecting with community resources that may improve their family's overall stability and financial independence.

Emergency Shelter and Social Services: Gives hope, alleviates human suffering and provides assistance with food, clothing and shelter for individuals and families in times of need or crisis. The homeless shelter

provides lodging, meals, telephone voicemail, mailboxes, showers, laundry facilities, clothing, casework, referrals and hygiene kits. Family services assist with rent, utilities, prescriptions, food vouchers, and hygiene boxes.

Summer Day Camp: Offers recreational activities such as arts and crafts, swimming, non-competitive team sports, and reading for children ages 4-12 from Lubbock and the surrounding area.

Women's Health Initiative: Focuses on medically underserved women, uninsured women, low-income, minorities, and younger women by providing them with access to breast and cervical cancer education, screening, treatment and post-diagnosis support.
